

JÁNOS MARTONYI – HUNGARY

János Martonyi is a law professor teaching private international law, international trade law and European law at the University of Szeged where he is the head of the institute for international trade law. He was a visiting professor at the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium, in Natolin, Poland, and at the Central European University in Budapest between 1994 and 1998.

In 1990-91 he served as State Secretary in the Ministry of International Economic Relations, from 1992 to 1994 as State Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. From 1998 to 2002, he was Foreign Minister in the center-right government of Hungary. From 1994 to 1998 and from 2002 until July 2009 he was the managing partner of the law firm Martonyi és Kajtár Baker & McKenzie, Budapest.

As an international arbitrator he is a member of the Board of the Permanent Arbitration Court at the Hungarian Chamber of Commerce and Industry. He is an elected member of the General Assembly of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and member of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts.

He is actively involved in politics as the President of the Free Europe Center for European Integration of FIDESZ Hungarian Civic Union, member of the Executive Board of the Centre for European Studies Foundation of the European People's Party, Brussels, and Chairman of the Perspective Foundation, Budapest.

Author of numerous articles and essays in various languages in the field of international trade law, competition policy and law, European integration and international politics. His main works are: 'The Legal Status of Transnational Corporations'; 'Central Europe and the European Integration'; 'Europe, Nation, Rule of Law'; 'Universal Values, Global Rules, Local Responsibilities'.

He is Minister for Foreign Affairs in the new center-right Hungarian government set up by May 2010.
